Chapter 2 Setting up the Monitor

2.1 Attaching the Stand Arm and Base

Step 1. Installing the Stand Arm


- Leave the monitor in its protective packaging.



Important


Place the monitor in its protective packaging, or on a soft, protected surface to avoid scratching the display screen.

- Align and slide the two tabs on the stand arm to the groove on the back of the monitor until it snaps into place.




Step 2. Installing the Stand Base

Insert the stand base to the stand arm and make sure it is securely installed.



Step 3. Placing the Monitor Upright

Lift the monitor carefully out of the foam packaging and into its upright position on a flat, stable surface.




Important

Be careful not to touch or press the screen area when lifting or moving the monitor to avoid any scratches or damage.


2.2 Detaching the Stand Arm and Base

Before removing the stand, be sure to turn off the monitor and disconnect all cables.

1. Press and hold the quick release tab at the bottom of the base and remove the stand base from the stand arm.




2. Press and hold the stand release button and pull to disengage the tabs on the stand arm from the monitor. Remove the stand (arm and base).



2.3 Making Connections

Connecting the Power Cord

Connect the power cord to the monitor and to an electrical wall outlet.



Important


Please make sure to make a grounding connection before connecting the power plug to the power source.

Additionally, when disconnecting the grounding connection, be sure to disconnect the power plug from the power source before proceeding.

Connecting the Monitor to the PC / Laptop


HDMI Connection

Connect one end of the HDMI cable to the HDMI connector on the rear side of the monitor. Then connect the other end to the HDMI connector on the PC or laptop.



VGA Connection

Connect one end of the VGA cable to the VGA input connector on the rear side of the monitor. Then connect the other end to the VGA output connector on the PC or laptop.



2.4 Adjusting the Viewing Angle

Tilt Angle Adjustment

For optimal viewing, it is recommended to look at the full face of the monitor, and then adjust the monitor's angle to your own preference.

Hold the stand firmly with one hand while tilting the monitor forwards or backwards with the other hand so you do not topple the monitor when you adjust the monitor's angle.

You are able to adjust the tilted angle from -5° to 20° .





2.5 Using the Security Slot

This monitor supports a Kensington-type security slot. The Kensington lock can be used to secure the monitor and prevent it from being stolen in public locations.




NOTE: Kensington lock is not included. You need to purchase an additional locking device.







Chapter 5 Operating the Monitor

5.1 Powering On/Off the Monitor

Press the Power button  to turn on the monitor. The power indicator lights up in solid blue to show that the monitor is ON.

To turn the monitor off, press and hold the Power button  about 3 seconds until the LED light on the Power button turns OFF.




The color definition of the power indicator:

LED Indicator	Status	Description
Solid Blue	On	Solid blue light indicates the monitor is turned on.
Flashing Blue	Standby	Flashing blue light indicates the monitor is in standby mode.
LED Off	Off	No light indicates the monitor is turned off.

5.2 Using the Joystick Control

Use the joystick on the rear side of the monitor to navigate the OSD menu and adjust the settings.

1. To access the OSD menu, press the joystick button to launch the OSD main menu.
2. Use the joystick to toggle between options.
3. Press the joystick button again to confirm the settings and exit.

2	Toggle Left		Toggles left to select menu items (Move), go back to the previous menu (Back) or exit the OSD menu (Exit) Decreases the parameters of the selected menu item (Adjust).

4	Toggle Up		Toggles up to select menu items (Move).

Power

- Make sure that the power voltage is within its safety range and has been adjusted properly to the value of 100~240V before connecting the device to the power outlet.
- If the power cord comes with a 3-pin plug, do not disable the protective earth pin from the plug. The device must be connected to an earthed mains socket-outlet.
- Please confirm the power distribution system in the installation site shall provide the circuit breaker rated 120/240V, 20A (maximum).
- Always disconnect the power cord or switch the wall socket off if the device would be left unused for a certain time to achieve zero energy consumption.
- Place the power cord in a way that people are unlikely to step on it. Do not place anything on the power cord.
- If this device comes with an adapter, use only the ASRock provided AC adapter approved for use with this device.
